Southborough woman named Volunteer of the Year

Southborough's Christine Tebaldi has won the 2013 Chandler Blackington award, given by the Disaster Services department of the American Red Cross of Eastern Massachusetts.

The Red Cross on June 18 recognized volunteers and partners from across the region at its annual Volunteer Appreciation Ceremony, this year held at Lombardo's in Randolph.

The award is given to a volunteer who has made a significant impact on the equality of service that the American Red Cross of Eastern Massachusetts is able to provide to a specific community through prolonged commitment and collaboration with other community partners.

Tebaldi serves as the regional Disaster Mental Health team leader. In addition to managing the regular activities of the mental health volunteers throughout Eastern Mass, Tebaldi also served as the Mental Health Chief during the Red Cross response to the Boston Marathon. She continues to work many house providing mental health coordination to the injured families and representing the Red Cross on many community meetings and collaborations.

"Ninety-five percent of our work hours providing disaster relief, emergency food and lifesaving skills are performed by volunteers.
