Team members explained to the crowd of onlookers that high school students built the moving, Frisbee-shooting robot in only 6 weeks before competing with it, and shared the FIRST premise that students are encouraged to pursue careers in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math. The crowd appeared to really enjoy engaging with the robot and with the friendly student representation from the Assabet Valley team.

Each team member received a free Providence Bruins ball cap for participating. The Providence Bruins Sales staff was so impressed with the friendliness and professionalism of the AZTECHS 157 Team, they invited the team back to do a demonstration with the 2014 robot next year.
