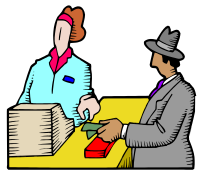
### BUY BY MAIL:

### IN PERSON:



Bring a check, proof of residency and a copy of your registration(s) to the DPW Office between 7:30am and 4:00pm Monday through Friday.

## WHERE DO I PLACE MY PERMIT?

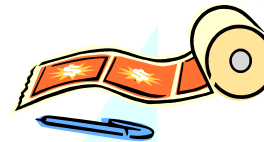
On the *outside* driver's side, front windshield or the **vertical surface** of the driver's side, front bumper.



### **\* PLEASE NOTE \***

RESIDENTS WITHOUT TRANSFER STATION PERMITS ARE **NOT** ALLOWED TO USE THE TRANSFER STATION. THIS INCLUDES THE REFUSE HOPPER AS WELL AS THE RECYCLING CENTER.

## WHY DO I NEED A TRANSFER STATION PERMIT?



In order to use the Southborough Transfer Station you must have a valid Southborough Transfer Station Permit.

A blue, 2020 permit will be available on July 1, 2019. The permit will be good until 9/15/20.

You must purchase a **blue**, 2020 Transfer Station Permit before 9/15/19 in order to use the Transfer Station after that date.

## I PREFER TO PAY TO HAVE MY TRASHED PICKED UP. DO I STILL NEED A TRANSFER STATION PERMIT?



**NO!** You are **not** required to purchase a Southborough Transfer Station Permit if you choose to utilize and pay for a private hauler. However, you will not be allowed to use any part of the Transfer Station, without a valid sticker.

## CURRENT GLOBAL RECYCLING ISSUES:

In 2018, China, the world's largest importer of recyclables, stopped accepting certain kinds of recyclables and tightened its impurity standards.



This policy change has wreaked havoc on the global recycling market, and has affected the Town of Southborough. Recycling at the Transfer Station is no longer free for the Town. However, recycling is still the law.

## WHAT CAN WE DO TO HELP?



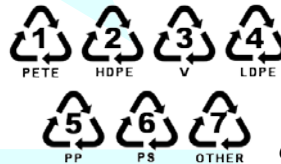
**Don't put recyclables in a bag** for recycling - bring plastic bags to local stores that recycle them.

**Understand the Mobius Band Myth.**



The Mobius band indicates that an item is recyclable, it doesn't mean that it can be recycled in this area.



A mobius band with a number in it, indicates the composition of the plastic. Southborough recycles numbers 1 & 2.

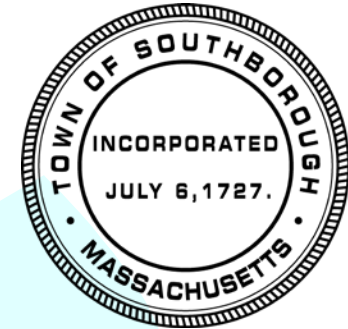
