Ian joined Cub Scouts as a Tiger Scout in 1st grade as part of Pack 26. Heather Gowdy was his Den Leader, and he joined the Pack along with Cole Gowdy, Nathaniel Mason, Owen Provencal, and Jackson Rosenstein. His family had only recently moved to Southborough a month before, and it was his first after-school activity where Ian could meet new friends and start to be involved in the community. As a Cub Scout, he went on his first-ever camping trip, memorized the Oath and the Law, and walked many miles selling wreaths and candles and exploring the town of Southborough. His Pack later merged with another Pack to become Pack 926.



Ian and his Den members became a part of Troop 1's Snow Leopard Patrol in 2017. As a member of Troop 1, Ian has been a Patrol Leader, Assistant Senior Patrol Leader, Senior Patrol Leader, Junior Assistant Scout Master, as well as Quartermaster and Historian. Ian has earned 27 merit badges as a Scout in Troop 1, became a member of the Order of the Arrow Tantamous Lodge in September 2022, and became an Eagle Scout in March 2024.

Ian has enjoyed many trips as part of Troop 1, including the Big Trip to Iceland and planning for the Big Trip to California. During the trips, Ian became more adept at meal planning and budgeting, which he carried forward into his culinary classes in High School. Ian's favorite trip was white water rafting, some of which he spent accidentally enjoying the ride outside the raft. It was a fun and exciting trip! Ian has also enjoyed attending Camp at Resolute and Squanto every year as part of Big Blue.

In addition to Troop 1, Ian is part of the culinary program at Assabet Valley Regional Technical High School. He is currently participating in the co-op program and works at True West Brewery in Acton. He also spends summers working at the Chowder Company on Martha's Vineyard. Ian also participates in the school band as a drummer (with a brief foray into piano and singing), plays volleyball, and is the Senior Class Student Council President.

The people he has met and the friends he has made as part of Troop 1 have been integral to his life and character. He is grateful for the shared experiences that have led to lifelong friendships.

Ian's Eagle Scout Service Project

My Eagle Scout Project was painting one of the hallways at Pilgrim Church in Southborough, Massachusetts. The Pilgrim Church was built in the early 1800s and has been a central part of our town's history. It is home to many gatherings in Southborough, including the weekly meetings for Troop 1.



My Eagle Scout mentor, Mr. Stewart, helped me contact Reverend Charley Eastman, who then put me in contact with Richard Snyder who is on the Buildings and Grounds Committee and worked with me extensively throughout the project. I also worked with Marjorie Coldwell who helped me refine the plan on what needed to be repaired.

The project included repainting a hallway of the church that needed chipped paint and dented walls repaired, as well as replacing an old register and bulletin boards. Over several weeks the Scouts sanded and prepped the hallway, spackled the walls, and repainted the entire hallway. As the finishing touch, we replaced the register and installed the new bulletin boards. I am very grateful to Mr. Greene, who guided me heavily through the council approvals and painted, to Mr. Henebury, who provided a lot of the materials and painted, and to Mr. Ponte, who provided tools and materials and taught us how to spackle correctly and paint well, and painted. I am grateful to all the scouts and adult leaders who gave their time and expertise to this project.

To fund the project, I held a holiday bake sale at the Southborough Transfer Station on December 23rd, 2023. The residents of Southborough were very generous, and we raised over \$1000, which funded the project with additional money to donate to the church. The younger Scouts showed some savvy sales techniques and a lot of energy during the process. The Scouts donated a lot of cookies and baked goods, mostly homemade but with some Little Debbie Snack Cakes thrown in as well.

I want to thank all of the Scouts, Scout Leaders, parents, and members of the Pilgrim Church who made this possible. Over the course of the project, I received a lot of time, materials, and advice and learned a lot about communication, scheduling, and time management. I would especially like to thank the Pilgrim Church for not only the help on the project but also the support and home they have given to Troop 1 through the years.

Colin Thomas Kessinger



Colin was introduced to Scouting by his brother Evan who had joined Cub Scouts as a Webelo and had crossed over into Troop 1 in March 2010. After attending the Pack 26 Southborough Cub Scout overnight trip to Camp Resolute in September 2012, Colin joined Pack 8 in November, led by Paul Deeley. In January 2013 Colin earned his Bobcat Badge, and in May earned his Wolf Rank, catching up with his Scoutmates - Nohl Carter, Matthew Deeley, Charlie Peters and Jackson Sheehan.

If anything was consistent about Colin's Cub Scout experience, it was change!

Colin enjoyed participating in Wreath Sales, Scouting for Food, Parades and several events such as the Celtics game and Pinewood Derby. Colin was very active in sports – hockey, baseball and soccer - and missed many events due to these conflicts.

Though Colin had been tagging along on Troop1 trips as a younger brother, always finding the “wrong” Scout to hang out with, he officially crossed over to Troop 1 in March 2016. He was very familiar with Troop 1 and soon bonded with his Buccaneer patrolmates: Josh Wood, Charlie Peters, Owen Jones, Will Purcell, Chase Whitney, Utsav Sethi and Ryan Ponte.

Colin enjoyed many trips, including summer camps at Resolute and Squanto, bike trips, hiking trips, shelter building and especially ski trips. Colin also was an eager volunteer for many Eagle Scout projects, community events, and Pancake Breakfast and Christmas Tree pickup. Colin cherished going on two Big Trips – 2019 to Iceland and 2023 to High Sierras in California. As a member of Troop 1, Colin forged many friendships, learned many important life skills, showed a great many qualities and grew significantly in his abilities. Colin held many roles in Troop 1 including Patrol Leader, Troop Guide, Assistant Senior Patrol Leader, Senior Patrol Leader and Junior Assistant Scoutmaster.

Arguably, Colin's greatest achievement in Scouting was helping to guide the Troop through the tumultuous days of COVID-19 Pandemic as the Senior Patrol Leader. Colin's consistent communication, constant motivation and can-do attitude made going online for Zoom Meetings and scaling back to local socially-distanced trips fun!

Colin's never-ending Eagle Scout Project was installing 2 bullpen mounds at the Mooney Field Complex for players using the “big” diamond.

Colin culminated his Scouting career with an 8-day trip to the High Sierras in California last summer for 30 members of the Troop – a trip he helped plan and execute with 4 other scouts and Scoutmaster. Outside of Scouts, Colin graduated from Assabet Valley Tech, played hockey and captained the baseball team, earning an all-star selection his senior year. Colin is currently an apprentice plumber working for DeWolfe Contracting.

Colin is very grateful for the help he received from Adult Leaders, the Committee and Scouts that helped him throughout his Scouting experience. They are the reason for his growth, maturity and success.

Colin's Eagle Scout Service Project

The planning for my Eagle Scout project began soon after I finished my role as SPL in the Fall of 2021. A big part of creating your project is having it be meaningful to you, and one of the most meaningful places to me is the baseball diamonds in Southborough. Baseball is a huge aspect in my life, and I grew up playing baseball at Mooney Field. I also played on the varsity team for Assabet, and I wanted my love for the game to be recognized down by the fields as something others can benefit from.



The Mooney Field Complex had been undergoing some major renovations at the time. The small softball field was being turned back into a baseball field with a plan to turf the inside dirt. Lights were added to the Eric Green Memorial Field the prior year (Eric was in my brothers Cub Scout Pack and died suddenly at the age of 12). An Eagle Scout project from a Scout in Troop 92 Southborough added a scoreboard to the Brian Shifrin Memorial Field (Mr. Shifrin helped coach me and I was teammates on Summer Allstars with his son Charlie). Another Eagle Scout project from a Scout in Troop 92 was in process to refurbish the Snack Shack at the field.

I wanted my project to be a part of this recent reconstruction process by building 2 much needed bullpens for the 90' diamond. The old "bullpen", if you can even call it that, was just an old beat-up home plate in which you would try your best to measure out 60.5' from the plate to get an accurate distance. The ground was also flat, unlike most bullpens and mounds which are elevated for the pitcher. So, my goal was to make 2 bullpens with raised mounds, a new home plate and rubber, and some form of backstop to block any baseballs that the catcher might miss.

I first spoke to former Southborough Little League president Mike Murphy in September 2021 about the possible project. He said that any addition to the field like my bullpens would mean a lot to the players and coaches who play on those fields but that I should also make sure that I discuss the potential project with the Southborough Recreation Department.

Before I could contact the Southborough Recreation Department, Southborough Little League and Northborough Little League announced a merger and merged in November 2021. The new Algonquin Baseball and Softball Association would be the beneficiary of the project. I met with Southborough Recreation Manager Tim Davis in January 2022, and he confirmed that the project could proceed. In March of 2022 the new ABSA board approved the project and finally I could make a presentation to the Troop 1 Committee and submit the project proposal to Mayflower Council.

By the time I got all signatures and the final signoff for the project from Mayflower Council, it was November 2022, and I wouldn't be able to start the project until Spring 2023. In March and April, I met with Chris Leroy from Southborough DPW and Mark Jablonski who takes care of the fields for ABSA. With their help measuring the area and delivering materials, I was able to start preparing for the project.

I held my first workday on May 13th to mark out the pitchers' mounds and home plate areas and dig these out. I also held a Bake Sale fundraiser on May 20th 2023 to help fund the project. My final workday was on May 27th where we built the mounds, installed the pitching rubbers and home plates.

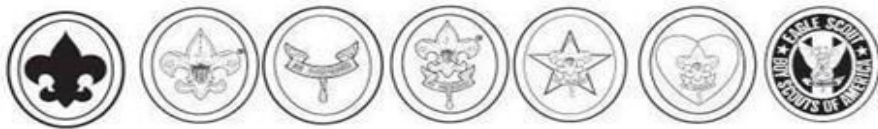

Nate's scouting career began as a Tiger Cub in Pack 926, Den 1. He loved the sleepaway trips to Higgin's Armory, the Eco Tarium and Paw Sox Stadium. He always felt a sense of deep purpose and pride in his contributions to the pack in wreath sales, and his contributions to the community in activities such as Scouting for Food, hosting a yard sale to benefit food allergy research and helping at a water table for a charity 10K.

Nate has fond memories of their first real camping and bike trip at Nickerson State Park, where he had his first taste of outdoor cooking, tenting, and Geocaching with his Den. His den leader, Heather Gowdy, saw his potential in Boy Scouts and helped guide him to choose Troop 1 along with his den-friends Joey Truman and Ian Cage.

With a strong affection for the outdoors and travel, Nate's favorite parts of Boy Scouts have involved camping, especially the Big Trips. The Iceland trip allowed Nate to use the independence and self-reliance learned during the weeks spent at Camp Resolute sleep-away camp to travel abroad without his family for the first time with confidence and Boy Scout-level preparation. This trip made an enormous impression on him, from the work and planning hours endured by the older Scouts to the chance to hike over breathtaking landscapes. He was excited for the chance to be on the planning committee for the next Big Trip.

Nate got his chance to plan a Big Trip for the summer of 2023 to California. He spent many hours and collaborated with his fellow older Scouts to plan a huge array of activities and sight-seeing. The trip was a huge success and made quite an impression on the younger Scouts. The planned activities provided fun for everyone, with biking, hiking, ropes and zip-lines, and even petting baby pigs at a farm. The trip gave Nate a chance to hike to the top of Half Dome at Yosemite National Park, a hike that is challenging to even skilled mountaineers.

Outside of Scouts, Nate has a strong interest in film production and business administration. He is pursuing a college degree that marries both interests after graduation from Algonquin Regional High School. He is also a talented musician. He played trumpet in the Symphonic Band through high school and has managed to teach himself how to play the guitar. He can play almost any classic rock song, including technical riffs.

Nate's Eagle Scout Service Project

As a sibling of a sister in several sports, Nate was dragged along to frequent game sidelines, often becoming bored. Living near Finn School, Nate often passed other kids in the same situation. This served as inspiration for his Eagle Project to build little libraries to house age-appropriate books at locations in need.



After researching possible structure designs, material costs, and speaking with school principals for permission, Nate was ready to present his plan to the Troop Committee for approval. After a challenging search, a beneficiary was secured, Tim Davis of the Southboro Recreation Department. The project was approved by Mayflower Council and Nate was ready to start, blueprints in hand.

Nate organized a bake sale at the transfer station which raised funding for the entire project. He was able to solicit enough donated used children's books to fill all the libraries. Being winter, work had to be completed indoors. Nate is grateful for the use of the Henebury barn which made this project possible. A preliminary workday was held with some of the older Scouts to build the first library as a prototype for the additional libraries that would be built. Two workdays with all ages of Scouts were completed in February of 2024 to have the libraries ready to go up as soon as the seasons changed. These libraries are being enjoyed by kids and make a great addition to sports fields and playgrounds in Southboro. Nate is so grateful to everyone that helped contribute to making this project a success. Thank you!

Nate will be off to college in the fall. He plans to attend the University of Rhode Island School of Business to study business and film production. The life skills learned in Boy Scouts will be invaluable to his success in the future.

Joseph (Joey) began his scouting experience in first grade as a member of Pack 921 Southborough along with nearly a dozen other boys. By the end of his first year his den had dwindled to just Joey and two other boys. By the following year it was just Joey in his den. He persevered, though, joining Pack 926 joining a den with both Ian Cage and Nate Mason (among others). Some of his favorite memories of Cub Scouts were the Paw Sox sleepovers. Nothing was better for young Joey than watching a baseball game, sleeping in the outfield, and falling asleep watching baseball movies as he was certain he would grow up to be a professional baseball player. In addition to the Paw Sox sleepovers, he always enjoyed the pinewood derby and the huge trophies he took home every year. In his final year in Cub Scouts he earned a spot to compete in the Pinewood Derby in Times Square in NYC.

Becoming a Boy Scout has been one of the most productive and worthwhile activities Joey has joined. He participated in many of the monthly outings and went on each outing at least once except the ski trip (even though Mr. Greene tried valiantly to convince him to go). Christmas tree pick-up, Scouting for Food, and the Pancake Breakfasts were among his favorite activities. It is always great to see so many former Scouts join in during those activities and support the troop. To top it off, it is hilarious to see how big of a pancake can be made or who can throw the first pancake onto the Ponte van.

His favorite trips, of course, were the Big Trips. He was a young scout on the Iceland Big Trip in 2019. Joey's first time out of the country was on this trip. In Iceland, Joey learned how to ice climb, rode Icelandic horses, went ziplining, explored an ancient lava tube, and hiked Mount Kristinartindar where glaciers could be seen calving in all directions. For the California Big Trip in 2023, Joey was a part of the leadership team where he successfully helped plan an amazing trip. Some of his fondest memories from the California Big Trip are kayaking on Lake Tahoe and running a 5k across the Golden Gate Bridge, but his most memorable accomplishment of the trip would be hiking nearly 20 miles to reach the summit of Half Dome in Yosemite with his dad, Mr. Kessinger, Colin, Utsav, and Nate. The extremely difficult and oftentimes scary hike was a huge achievement.

In addition to being on the Big Trip leadership team, Joey held many other roles within the troop. He was Game Master, Trips ASPL, Senior Patrol Leader, and Junior Assistant Scoutmaster. During his time as the SPL, he successfully led his Klondike team to a complete all events for the Klondike Derby for the first time in many years. He is also a member of the Order of the Arrow.

As well as being involved in Scouting, Joey also competed in Cross Country, Swimming, Baseball, and Track while at Algonquin Regional High School and has even completed a triathlon. He hopes to continue running while he attends UMASS Lowell in the fall. Joey is graduating tomorrow, and he plans on majoring in Chemical Engineering.

Joseph's Eagle Scout Service Project

My Eagle project was an installation of 18 disk golf targets in the ground at Chapel of the Cross in Westborough, Massachusetts. I have attended Chapel of the Cross for my whole life, and I wanted to do a service project there to give back to the church. Originally,

I planned to create a hiking trail around the lake that is on the church property but there were a few hiccups with the Westborough environmental committee due to the proposed trail passing through a wetlands area. So I decided to switch gears and install a disk golf course. The Church had originally put up temporary disk golf targets during the pandemic lockdown for the youth group and local community to use, but they were just temporary disk golf targets cemented in five gallon buckets that were spread all around the church property.



Throughout the years these have been knocked over by weather, relocated by landscapers, and buried under snow banks by snow plows. I wanted to make a permanent installation that wouldn't have any of these issues.

My Project was completed on November 11, 2023 and had over 220 working hours involved. I held 2 main work days with more than a dozen scouts and adults pitching in for various installation tasks. A total of 13 pizzas were consumed during the two work days. Additionally, my dad and I worked numerous evenings at the church digging holes, planning the course layout, and adding mulch. One of the most difficult parts of this project was coordinating installation of targets that were spread out all over the church property. Transporting mulch from the parking lot where it was delivered to the furthest hole took considerable effort as did excavating numerous huge rocks out of the ground. It was also difficult having a work day in the pouring rain, which somehow still had great attendance. We used pop up shelters to work under while digging holes and placing the targets. About half way through the work day the rain was falling so hard that it completely filled up one of the holes that we had just dug for a target with water.

Throughout this project I was able to use my leadership skills to show people how to use the tools that we needed, make sure that each of the work groups had needed supplies, and I was able to train other scouts to lead smaller groups working on target installations that were at the far ends of the church.

My fundraiser for this project was a bake sale that was held at the Southborough transfer station. Many scouts kindly made and donated lots of brownies, cookies, etc. During this fundraiser, I was able to raise more than \$1,500 which was used to buy the tools, materials, and 5 yards of mulch needed to complete this project. I was also fortunate that many scouts brought yard tools from home to assist in this project.

I would like to thank Chapel of the Cross for allowing me to give back to a place that has given me so much. I would also like to thank my family for pushing me to continue my journey in scouts, all of the scout masters for guiding me through my scouting journey, and my fellow scouts and friends who were always there when I needed a laugh.
